It's been a busty month, with Tom Cousins' talk on 30th November, followed by the Society's Christmas Event, on 7th December. Tom's talk, on a thirteenth century shipwreck found just outside Poole harbour, was fascinating, with amazing graphics and information. What made it very special for many of us was that Tom had brought several of the artefacts found on the sea bed to the talk, and we were able to handle real 13th Century objects. There were several stone mortars (as in 'pestle and mortar') and it was possible to see the tool-marks on the mortars, as fresh as if they had just been finished, all preserved by the silt on the sea bed.
