The first, on Saturday 29th July, at 10.30am. is 'The Manor of Ailwood: An introduction to the history of the landscape of East Purbeck', led by Mary Sparks.

Meet: North side of Harman's Cross crossroads, by bench

Parking: in car park opposite Harman's Cross Village Hall, Haycrafts Lane.

Time: c. 2hrs max. 3 miles – much along roads. **3 stiles**

Waterproof footwear and leg coverings needed (tall grasses)

You have a choice of dates for the second walk. Reg Saville's 'A Trail through Langton Matravers', which will go down and up the village street on Friday 18th or Saturday 19th August, starting at 10.30am at the Museum, St Georges Close, BH19 3HZ. This walk, which should take c. 2 hours, will be limited to a maximum of 10 participants per group, owing to lack of space on the pavements.
